INTRODUCTION

The Leeu-Gamka Water Treatment Works (WTW) was completed in the 2016/17 financial year, funded by Department Human Settlements and constructed by the Implementing Agent, ASLA, as part of the upgrade of the water supply to the Transnet area in Leeu-Gamka.

The project entailed the treatment of the Transnet borehole yield, which though was of high quantity, deteriorated in quality. It was found that the Fluoride levels of the yield were outside and above the potable water norms. This implied that the borehole was to be decommissioned, which would have led to an untenable situation, as the borehole supplies a high percentage of the water demand.

The system utilizes Reverse Osmosis and Ultra Filtration to separate and dilute the Fluoride and provide a very good quality of water. The system however comprises of very expensive and sensitive equipment and telemetric monitoring and oversight of the highly specialised equipment is needed
